What's New?

The next phase of construction has begun: ER Nurse Station! The construction barriers were installed and demolition started in this phase. The rough ins began in the Outpatient Clinic and will be ready for drywall installation. The lower level of the new Clinic / Med Surge addition is nearly complete with the finish work, the flooring is finishing up and ceiling tile will be dropped into place. The upper level of the new Clinic / Med Surge addition has the headwalls set into their final places! The ceiling grid installation started and MEP fixtures will follow. The bathroom tile is also ongoing. Many tours were held within the Main Street space to show the user group the construction progress. An employee recognition lunch was also held for both the owner and construction crews.

The photos above depict the various steps required in order to install the concrete on the Grand Stair. Wheel barrels are used to haul the concrete from the pump truck into the building and then shoveled into buckets to be carried to each step and poured into place.



In the upper level Med Surge / Clinic addition, bathroom tile is being installed as well as millwork and the ceiling grid. After these go in, the MEP trades will go through and install their fixtures such as sinks and lights.

A headwall unit is placed in its final resting location after the MEP rough ins have been installed. The next step will be to install the MEP trim within the unit.
